The 107th Congress is addressing a broad range of civilian, military, and commercial space issues. The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) conducts the most visible space activities. NASA's International Space Station (ISS) program is the most controversial because it is over budget, behind schedule, and relies on Russia for some hardware and services. Nevertheless, it has survived 22 termination attempts in NASA funding bills since 1991. Other NASA issues are whether NASA is adequately managing its flight programs, ensuring the safe operation of the space shuttle, effectively developing new launch vehicles, and facilitating space commercialization. NASA requested \$14.5 billion for FY2002; Congress approved \$14.9 billion. The FY2003 request is \$15.1 billion.
