To make up for that lack of melodic Fluency, the two harmonies should be tied together all the more firmly; while in the major key the harmonic connection could be neglected, since the melodic coherence was better. Therefore the attempt will be made to retain as many tones of the first chord as possible--or perhaps the whole chord--for the succeeding step: In order to make room for the succeeding tone of the melody, the two upper tones (e and gf) are placed in the lower octave. Here appears a new harmony e--gt--b f, which shows even the normal third-structure--but with the gap between b and f. The second harmonic mass also contained such a gap (page 24), by the filling of which the dominant-chord was gained. Here, too, it will be filled with the intermediate third.
